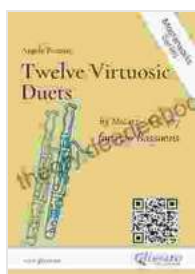

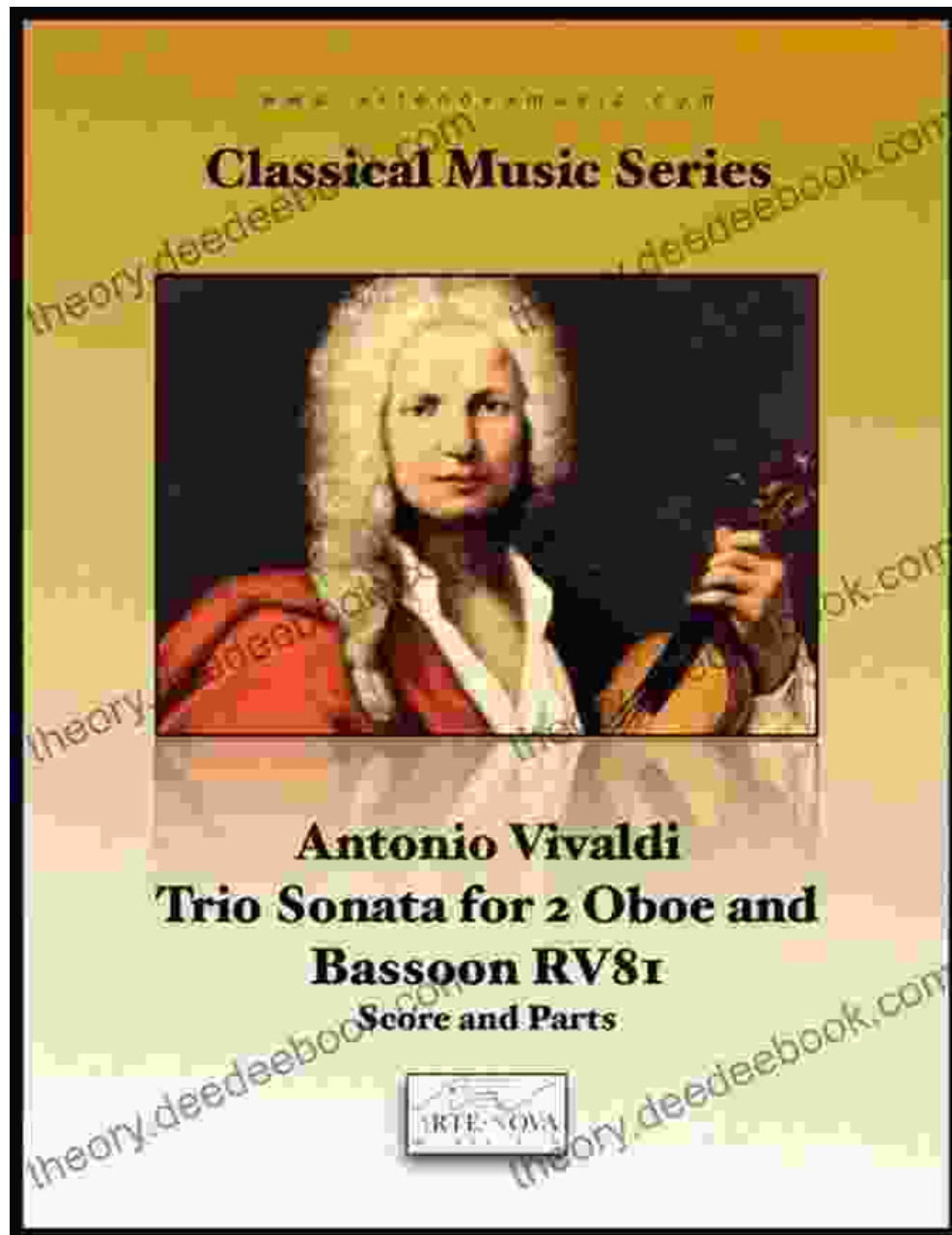

4. Antonio Vivaldi: Sonata for Two Bassoons in G Minor, RV 81



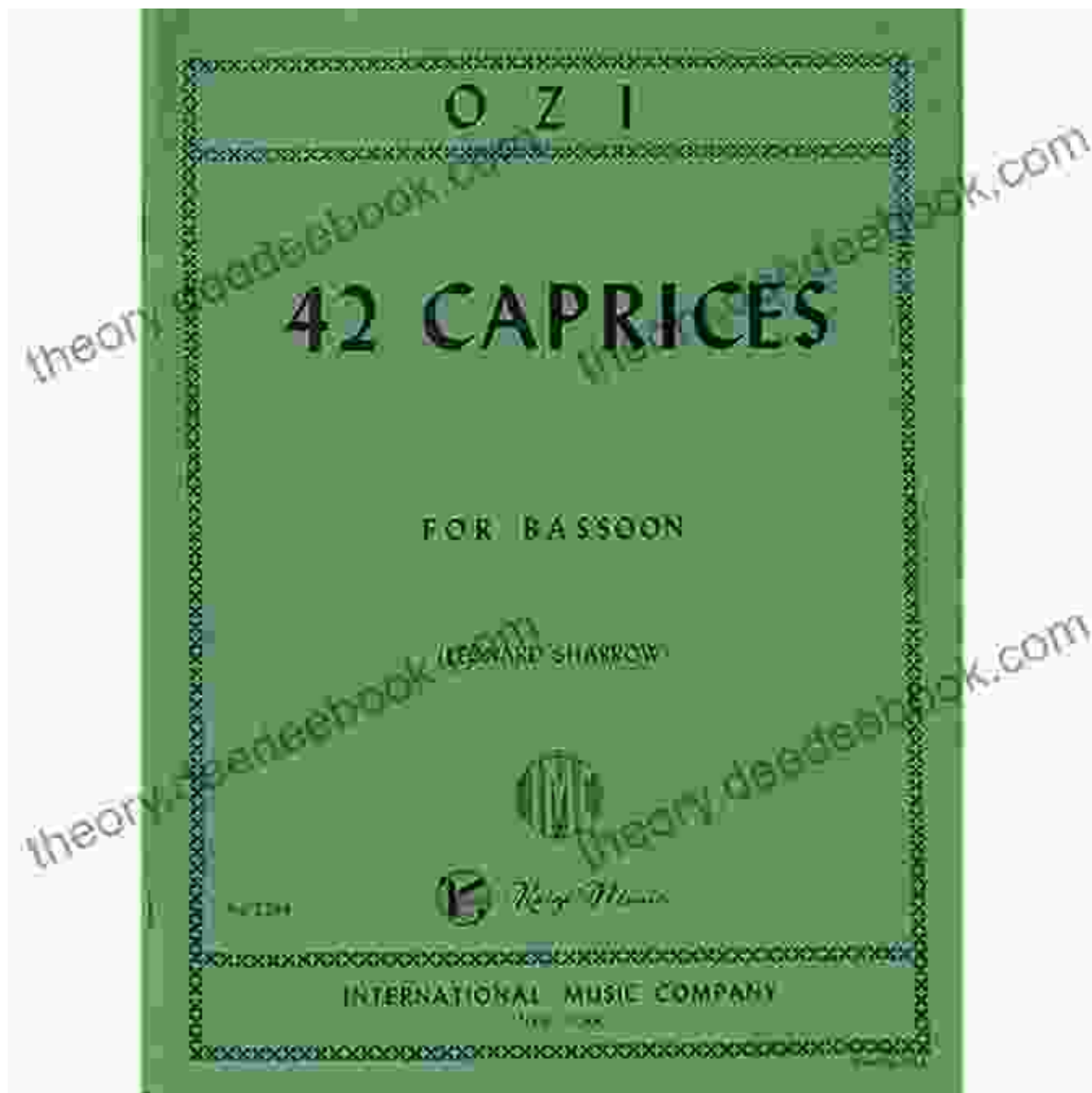
